The Fifth Sunday after Pentecost 23rd June 2024

Dear Parishioners, below I quote our Bishop, using words he has written today for the Cathedral Parish Pewsheet. It was good to have Bishop Clarence with us last Sunday and I trust you found the information sharing to be helpful at this time.

"This afternoon at 1.45pm, the Parish Councils of both the Cathedral and Wangaratta West will meet at Purbrick Hall to further conversation about how the cooperative ministry will work, to share in fellowship and to get to know one another.

Hopefully during July, we will create an opportunity for both congregations to meet at Bishop's Lodge for a meal and to get to know each other. I want to stress again that this is not a process of amalgamation, but a hope that the Wangaratta Anglicans will begin to look at one another as they will share a Priest with effect 1 September."

Birth of John the Baptist-June 24.

John, the son of Elizabeth, a relative of Mary, and of Zechariah, a priest, was born six months before our Lord. The series of miraculous events connected with John's birth indicated that his was to be no ordinary vocation. The angel Gabriel, having been sent by God, appeared to Zechariah, while fulfilling his priestly duties in the Temple, to inform him that his wife Elizabeth, who was both barren and well along in years, was to have a son. When Zechariah expressed his doubt, he suddenly became mute (Luke 1:1–25). Later, when Mary visited Elizabeth, the unborn child in Elizabeth's womb leaped with joy in the presence of his Lord (Luke 1:39–41). And as today's Gospel reading (Luke 1:56–66, 80) narrates, at the child's circumcision, Zechariah suddenly regained his voice, when he insisted that the child's name was John, the name given him by the angel. John was to be no ordinary saint; he was chosen by God to have a very special place in the role of redemption—it was his task to preach repentance and prepare the people for Christ's coming.

It is infrequent that the Church in her liturgical calendar celebrates a birthday; there are only three such, that of Christ (December 25), that of our Lady (September 8), and today's, that of John the Baptist. For all other saints, we regularly celebrate the day they died, that is, their birthday in Heaven. John's unique role was that of precursor—he was chosen to prepare the world for the coming of Christ.

N.B. August 29 commemorates the Beheading of John the Baptist.

Irenæus, c.200

Irenæus was probably a native of Smyrna, born in about the year 130. As a boy, he had heard Polycarp preach, who had in turn been a disciple of the apostle John. Irenæus is thus one of the important connections between the apostolic Church and the second century. He studied at Rome, and became a priest at Lyons in Gaul, succeeding as bishop upon the martyrdom of his predecessor in 177. He contended against the mythological, unhistorical beliefs of the Gnostics, giving positive value to the full humanity of the incarnate Christ, and affirmed the public teaching rôle of the episcopate to combat false doctrine. He is honoured as the first great Catholic theologian, one who drew upon the emerging traditions of East and West. Irenæus died in about the year 200.
