Frances Perry (December 2) Charles Perry accepted the new bishopric of Melbourne in 1847 and he and Frances left England in October on the Stag. The party reached Port Phillip on 23 January 1848, then just a dozen years since its being founded. They immediately set out on their task, to advance the Church of England in the new colony of Victoria in both public and private spheres. Frances coped with demanding work as Charles' personal assistant, while coping with the expectations of local gentry: she was recalled by Mary Stawell as "a lively good little woman, nothing very particular as a companion, and has a good deal of English wit or kitten liveliness". She especially disliked tea meetings: "I cannot help considering them useful things, but I get dreadfully tired, and shirk them whenever I can".

Frances accompanied Charles on long journeys through his huge diocese, riding, walking, and staying in rough quarters. She wrote copiously about the country she found herself in — its flora and fauna, the Snowy Mountains, the heat, flies, bushfires and discovery of gold. Her colourful letters were published under the pseudonym 'Richard Perry', and show a detailed interest in the people and landscapes she encountered.

Frances' chief work was as founding president of the Melbourne Lying-in and Infirmary for Diseases of Women and Children (now Royal Women's) Hospital, from 1856 to

1874, the modern day Frances Perry House perpetuates her memory. After the Melbourne Hospital declined to set up a midwifery section, she helped negotiate the new institution's establishment with two local doctors and a Ladies' Committee (supported by a smaller Gentlemen's Committee) the first version of the Rules drawn up by the Ladies' Committee stated that the hospital would run according to "the principles of the Christian Religion as these are received by the various Evangelical branches of the Protestant Church". Morning and evening prayers were to be read by the Matron, including appeals to the Creator for mercy, pity and forgiveness for suffering.
