## A Message from the Dean

Dear Parishioners,

We have arrived at the first weekend of November and the first of the new edition of the Jazz and Blues Festival and my first Jazz Mass as the new Dean. When I was a Curate in Maryborough (VIC) in 1987, some parishioners from there travelled to Wangaratta for a Jazz festival and were excited to be attending a worship service as part of that event. Those who know the history of the Wangaratta Jazz and Blues Festival will recognise that this pre-dates the Festival which has had a Jazz Mass as part of it for so many years. Whatever it was that those people participated in back in 1987, this Sunday we continue the tradition of offering worship to God which incorporates some aspects of Jazz and Blues music. That this Sunday we are celebrating All Saints is a happy coincidence because it reminds us all once again that what we do now on earth is part of a greater worship taking place continually in the dimension where the Almighty God dwells—we commonly call this place heaven. Sometimes events here on earth are so transporting in their effect that we exclaim "it's a bit of heaven on earth"!

While not every occasion of worship falls into this category, it is our hope that most times our worship of God offers a little bit of a glimpse onto God and life eternal. This is often dependent on how well focussed we are on what is happening, how 'in the moment and present' we are so that we are taken out of ourselves and into the Presence of God.

The Greek word usually translated saint is *hagios*. Literally it is an adjective meaning: "holy" It can refer to "holy things" or "holy people". The word "holy" means "to set apart". To paraphrase it, holy means "special". Holy Communion is a "special" fellowship between God and us and each other. The Holy Bible is a "special" book. The Holy Spirit is the "special" breath or wind from God. So what's a saint? A saint is a holy person, a special person.

Being a saint comes as a gift from God. You are a saint because you are in contact with the Holy God—or better, because the Holy God has come in contact with you. Being a saint is not something you do for yourself, although we often use the word in that way. We often think of a person as a saint because they live a very good life, but a saint is a saint because of his/her contact with the Holy God.



## Welcome to our guest artists today



Pianist **Bob Sedergreen** is an Australian jazz legend. He has worked with John Sangster, Don Burrows, and Brian Brown and supported Nat Adderley, Dizzy Gillespie, and Milt Jackson. Bob was born in Mandatory Palestine, and after 1948 he migrated with his family first to London, and then to Melbourne in 1951. Bob's sons Steve and Mal are also musicians, playing piano and saxophone.

Bob played with the Fred Bradshaw Quartet (1962–70), Ted Vining Trio (1971– present), Alan Lee's Plant (1973), Brian Brown's Quintet (1974) and Brian Brown's Quartet (1977–79). In the 1980s, he worked with the Australian Jazz Ensemble, Onaje and Peter Gaudion's Blues Express and the popular Blues on the Boil.

Bob has toured extensively both around Australia and overseas, including Montreal, Malaysia and Europe. He has been advisor to the Montsalvat International Jazz Festival and involved in the introduction of new talent as well as negotiating and supervising the Nat Adderley Quintet and the McCoy Tyner Trio.

As an educator, Bob has lectured at the Victorian College of the Arts and the University of Melbourne's Faculty of Music. He has also been an artist-in-residence at many Victorian secondary schools. Bob has also toured with the popular rock band Led Zeppelin playing the bagpipes.

Sedergreen began hourly sets in Melbourne, Australia, in 2007, where he has taken to narration while performing the music of his life, taking time for comments, while still playing in chronological order to entertain the public in a one-man jazz show, called, "Hear Me Talking to Ya" named after a Nat and Cannonball Adderley tune. He has worked as a band director at Blackburn High School, and also has worked at Ringwood Secondary College with his wife of 69 years Rae Sedergreen.



**Annemarie Sharry** is an alumnus of the Victorian College Of The Arts. She is much in demand as a choral director, where she shares her passion for Gospel, African, and Australian music. With a dynamic voice and a sense of humour that can bring a room to tears of laughter, Annemarie is a true innovator both as a solo performer and as a member of award-winning a cappella groups.
